Mary Mouzon-Wright, the eldest born of seven to the late Reverend Johnnie Mouzon, Sr. and Sallie Williams-Mouzon was born September 9, 1937 in Manning, South Carolina. She was preceded in death by three brothers and two sisters.

“**Ree**” as she was affectionately called, received her formal education in the public schools of Clarendon County and graduated from Manning Training School in 1956.

She later married the late Moses Wright and moved to South Norwalk, Connecticut and lived there for 40 years. While there she joined the Saint Paul Church of God in Christ (COGIC) under the leadership of Pastor James E. Miller where she served on the Pastor’s Aid Committee, sung with the choir and became a licensed Deaconess.

She was one who loved God, her family and the church. While living in Connecticut, she worked as a Home Health Caregiver and later as a cashier at Pathmart Grocery Store. Mary and her husband moved back to South Carolina in 1999. Mary joined Macedonia Missionary Baptist Church and served on the same committees there. During that time Mary did in-home childcare.
