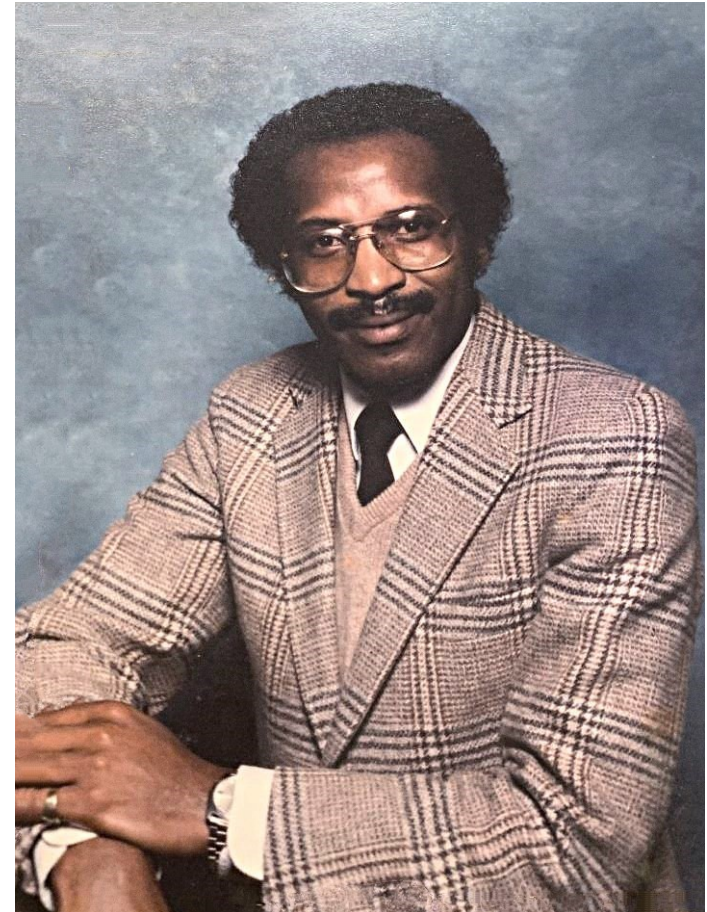

OBITUARY

Curtis Lindsay, Sr. was born August 26, 1944, in Gastonia, NC to the late Mary Williams Lindsay and Collie Lindsay. He passed on Friday, June 23, 2023, at the age of 78 in Gastonia, NC.

Curtis was educated in York and Gaston County Public Schools. He graduated from Lincoln High School in 1963. He was chosen by his peers as Mr. Senior Class. He was president of the Science Club, a member of the Library Club, FTA, Chorus, Athletic Association, English Club, and Class Treasurer. His class saying was, 'Three can keep a secret, if two die.' Upon graduation, he attended Belmont Technical School, where he excelled in weaving and designing. He worked for Burlington Industries in Gaston County until they sent him to New York, where he worked in their Gayley & Lord office until they closed. Upon returning to Gastonia, he worked for Matthew Belk in Eastridge Mall. He was then transferred to the store at Dixie Village, where he was the Manager. When that store closed, he worked at Matthew Belk in Shelby until he retired.

Curtis was preceded in death by his parents and three sisters: Lucinda Setzer, Mable Burris, and Mildred Beatrice Williams.

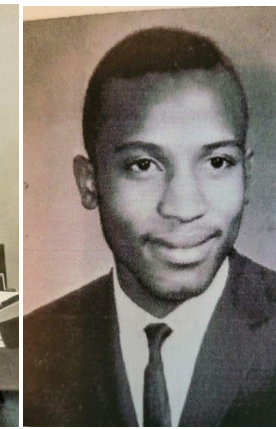
