Look at my Father's Fruit. I will share them with you. Thank you, Lord for letting me bloom where I am planted. Amen.

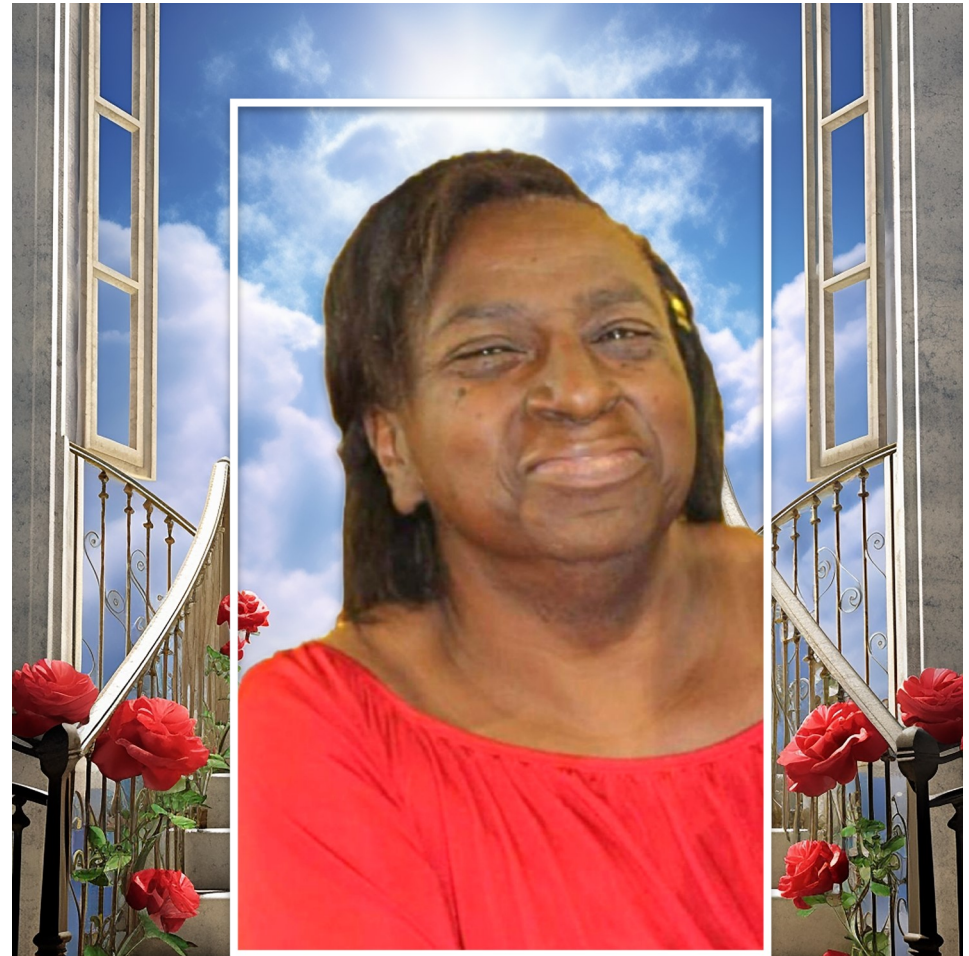
