Elizabeth Joy Worthy Graves, 82, was born to the late Lindsay and Ida Worthy in Bessemer City, NC on March 9, 1942. She departed this life

on August 11, 2024.

Joy attended Stewart Elementary and Lincoln High School, graduating in 1960. While at Lincoln High School, she played basketball and enjoyed singing in the choir. She furthered her education at Johnson C. Smith University, majoring in economics in 1964. During her time as a Golden Bull, she pledged Gamma Lambda Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. in 1962. Later, she earned a Master of Education Administration degree from the University of North Carolina at Charlotte in 1978.



She was an educator in Annapolis, Maryland, Alexandria, Virginia and Gaston County Schools, retiring in 1998. She then worked in Student Life Administration at Johnson C. Smith University, Livingstone University and Barber Scotia College. While her daughter was posted as a diplomat in Cairo, Egypt, she taught 3rd grade for 3 years, which she expressed was "one of the best experiences of her life".

Joy was an active member of the Charlotte Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta (DST) Sorority, Inc., Senior Citizens Organization (in which she was the Queen) and a host of community engagement projects.
