eyes filled with tears for me.

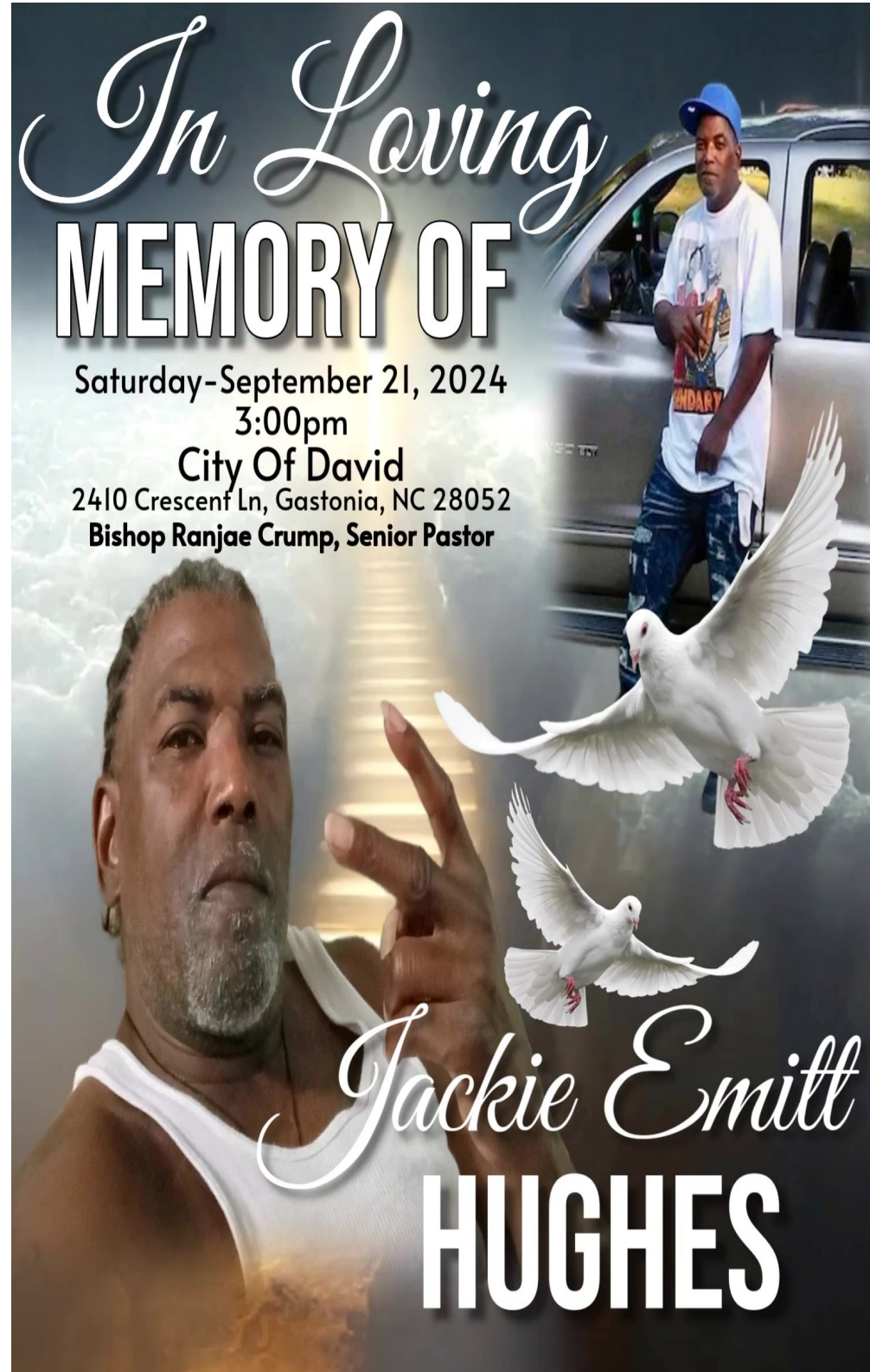
I wish so much you wouldn't
