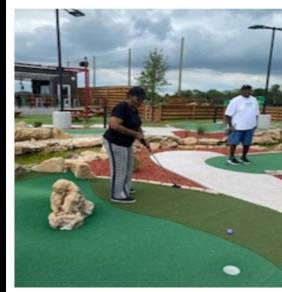

She was a PK (Preacher's Kid) so, church and a strong biblical foundation was established early and maintained throughout her life. Her adventures often included her biological sister, Cleaster, and her cousin, Brenda, whom she considered and always referred to as a sister. It was said Roberta had three girls because they were always seen together. Adventures that included dancing, were always a favorite for Barbara. She enjoyed showing off her moves. After graduating from Highland High in 1960, Barbara went to college in Durham; however, that was short lived. She returned home by way of her high school sweetheart, and they were married on October 5, 1960. Charles was the love of her life and because of their union she was blessed with "her three girls".

Barbara loved people, especially children. She said children did not ask to come here so, you should always love and care for them. She worked at the Orthopedic Hospital, an institution for crippled children in Gastonia. It was the first of its kind in the south and she loved it! When the institution closed, she went to work at the Gaston County Health Department. She worked in maternity and was able to continue engaging with women and children. Her passion and love were evident through her service, and she was loved and highly respected by both patients, doctors, and peers. Barbara became known as a servant of her community through countless acts of kindness and compassion.

Her love for her family and friends was even greater! Barbara enjoyed cooking, baking, shopping, and taking care of her family. People often asked her to bake for them and called to ask how to make a dish she had prepared. She lovingly shared her knowledge about cooking, baking, children and anything else she could to make others happy. She did not like discourse and drilled this in “her three girls” heads. As her family grew larger through grandchildren and great grandchildren, she lovingly became known as “Granny” to others who met her as they engaged with her children and grandchildren. Barbara often graciously provided childcare to both her own immediate family members and others with a smile on her face.

Barbara's growing age and health issues never stopped her from meaningful engagement through both hobbies and travel, including mountains, beaches and even big cities. She valued her independence and displayed continued resiliency. It is believed her youthful spirit, positive attitude, and determination carried her well beyond the prognoses of some healthcare professionals.
