Life Reflections

Susanna Tims Lee (67 years old) of 551 Barrett Rd Clover, SC (the home of her parents) transitioned to her Mansion in Heaven on January 26, 2025, but will be forever loved by all of her family and friends. Susanna was the seventh child of William Cephus and Susanna Lowery Tims. She was born on July 27, 1957, in York County, South Carolina. She was not alone, as she had a womb partner, Susan Tims.

Susanna received her high school diploma in the Clover School District in 1975. She also attended Gaston College, Cleveland Community College, Friendship Jr. College, and Winthrop College, where she pursued a degree in Elementary Education. However, after getting pregnant at 42 years old in her third year of college, she chose to drop out since she was at high risk in her pregnancy. On February 11, 1999, Susanna achieved her greatest reward, her daughter, Shekilyn (meaning the glory of God), after she had five previous miscarriages.

Susanna worked 15yrs at Firestone as a quality control assistant. She also worked at Marion Yarns in Clover for 10yrs. She was diagnosed with SLE Lupus in 1982, but God saw fit to heal her of Lupus, and she went back to work for Walmart and Food Lion.

Susanna joined Weeping Mary Baptist Church at an early age, singing in the gospel and hymn choir and performing the service as an usher. She later joined Greater Life Ministries under the leadership of Pastor Terry Wallace Jr. After many years, she was led back to Weeping Mary under the leadership of Rev. Robert L. McCaskill. While at WBMC, she taught the teenage and young adult classes. She also mentored Minister Latonya Brice in teaching the Word of God.
