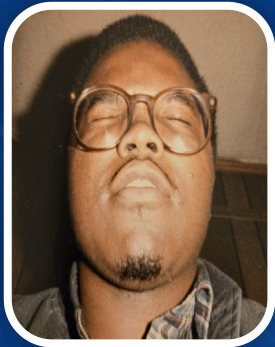


God's Garden

On Saturday, February 8, 2025, a good man, Eugene “Buck” Barnett, was called to his eternal rest. He was born on November 17, 1963, in Gastonia, NC to the late William “AC” and Alice Barnett.

In addition to his parents, he was preceded in death by his only sibling, Sandra Barnett and his special uncle, Alfred Brown.

Eugene attended school in the Gaston County Public School system but did not finish his education there. However, he knew he needed to complete what he started. So, he returned to school and completed course work to finish his GED. He was employed with the City of Gastonia for a while until his failing eyesight caused him to leave the workforce.

He made you feel as if you were important and “heard”. His smile and laughter made it easy to be in his presence. He had a good sense of humor and keen intelligence.
