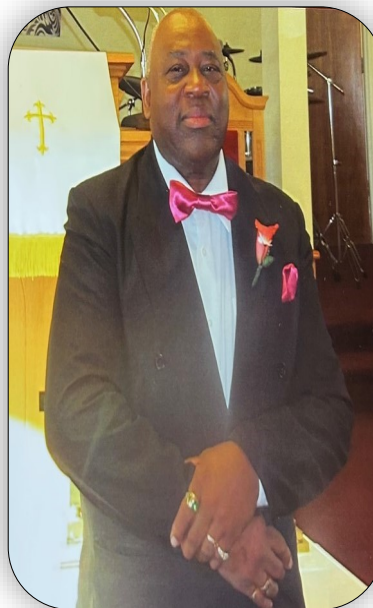

Mr. Ernest Lee Adams, third son of the late Harry B. Adams, Sr. and the late Mable L. Adams, was born in Gastonia, North Carolina. He departed this life at home with a strong will to live on Monday; April 14, 2025. He lost his will to live with his wife of 51 years along his bedside caring for him.

He loved his church where he and his wife, Carol, joined at an early age and bought their boys up in the church until his sickness took him done. He came down with Rheumatoid Arthritis at the age of 30. He learned to cope with it. But did not let it stop him from visiting his family and friends and his love for churches. After already having rheumatoid arthritis went under a total knee replacement. But still didn't let that stop him. In 2020 he had a blow out of his colon and had a ostomy bag but got reversed a year and eight days later. He still didn't let that stop him.

He was supposed to go in 2023 for a hip replacement but because of insurance reasons that was put on hold. In the spring of 2024, he was again to have a total hip replacement but because of a heart blockage, he went through multiple numbers of test. He was again delayed because of a low level of iron and was put in the hospital with kidney failure for 19 days. He went to rehab for 15 days. After the days in Rehab, he came home bedridden from November 15 to April 14 until he departed this life. But from his bed, he still didn't let that stop him. He would call people on the phone to ask them about their belief and faith in God. He will be missed from going and visiting family and friends and people whom he loved to see.
