# Honoring the Life of Grace Moore Green

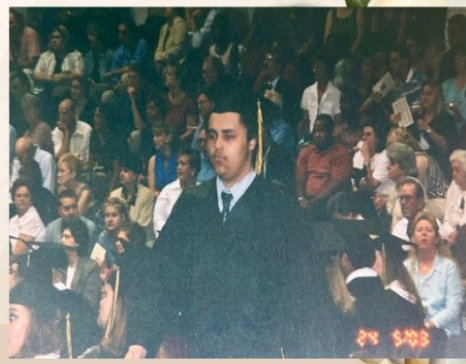
