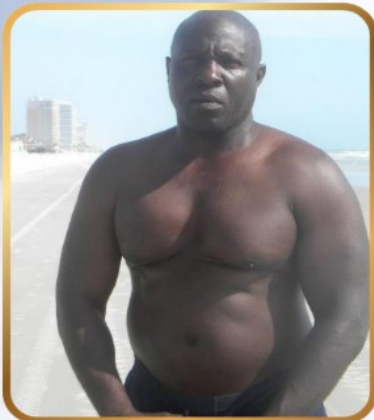


Reggie

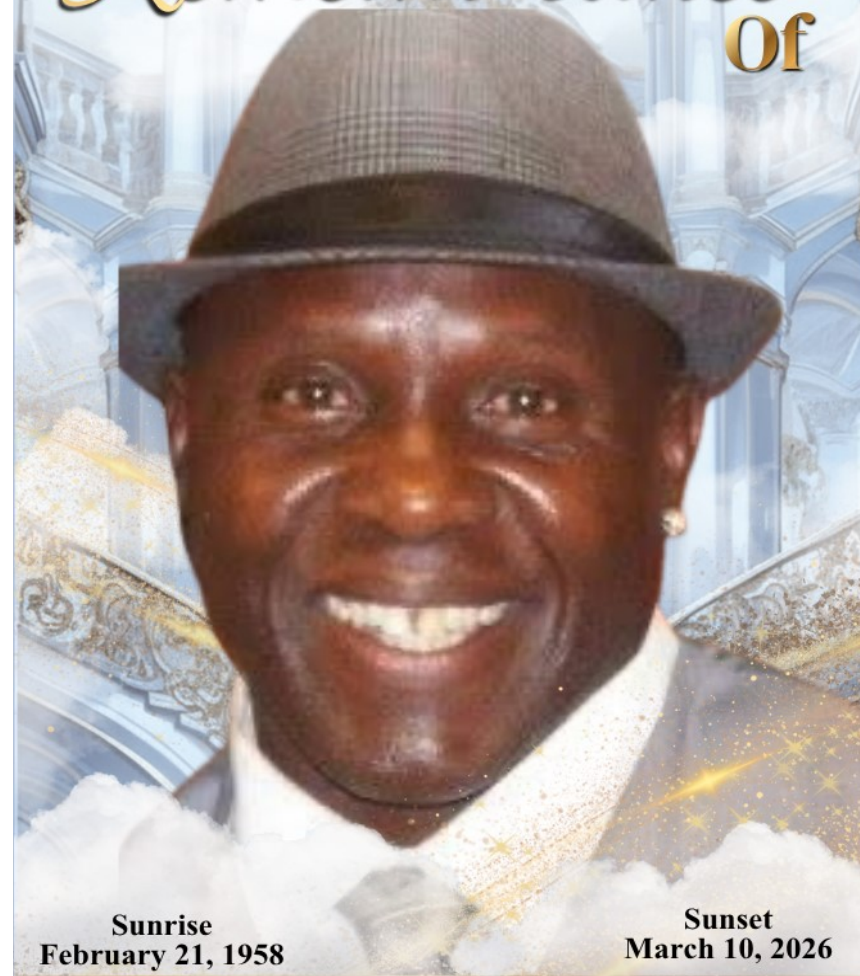

Reginald "Reggie" Glenn Clinton was born on February 21, 1958, to Grace Rhodes and Glenn Keaton. He was later adopted by his stepfather, Howard Clinton. Reginald transitioned on Tuesday; March 10, 2026 at Presbyterian Hospital in Charlotte, North Carolina. To those who knew and loved him, he was also known as "Bear," a name that fit his strong presence and warm spirit.

Reggie grew up attending Friendship Baptist Church, where he was first introduced to the faith that would stay with him throughout his life.

He attended Hunter Huss High School and graduated in 1976. While there, Reggie made a name for himself as a standout football player. His love for the game carried on as he continued his education at Ferrum College, where he kept playing the sport he enjoyed and loved so much.

Reggie later joined the United States Army, where he proudly served as an Airborne Ranger in the 82nd Airborne Division. His time in the military showed his courage, discipline, and dedication.

As the years went on, Reggie felt called to reignite his relationship with Christ. He rededicated his life and went on to attend seminary school, earning a Bachelor of Arts degree in Pastoral Ministry from The College at Southeastern. His faith became an important part of who he was and how he lived and carried himself on a daily basis.

Reggie will be remembered for his strength, his kind heart, and the way he made people feel seen, valued, and loved. He had a steady presence, a warm spirit, and a way with words that would bring comfort and encouragement to those around him.

Reggie was preceded in death by his mother, Grace Rhodes Clinton; his father, Glenn Keaton; his stepfather, Howard Clinton; and his brother, Michael Wayne Clinton.

He leaves behind so many who will cherish his memory—his son, Reginald Clinton; his brothers, Timothy Clinton, Wendell Clinton, and Marcus Clinton; his stepmother Winnie Keaton; his seven grandchildren; and a host of nieces, nephews, extended family, and friends who will truly miss him dearly.
