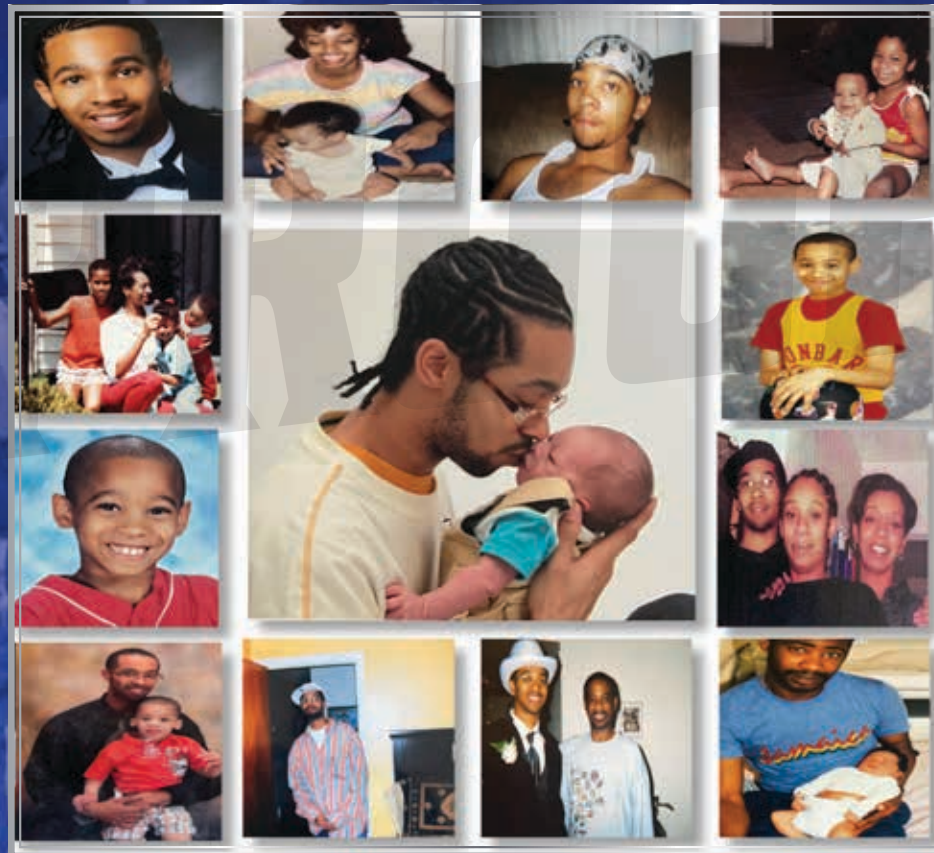
He was also a drummer in the marching band at Bryan Station High School, his alma mater. For the past several years, Theo’s illness prevented him from doing lots of things he enjoyed.
