Margaret "Peggy" Seals was born on November 21, 1941, to her parents, Bertie and Mary E Seals, in Winchester, Ky. She had two children who were the lights of her life Stacey E Owsley and Gregory D Seals Sr. In addition to her parents and children, she is preceded in death by her granddaughter, Latina Seals.

Peggy, as she was called by most who knew her, lived a life full of accomplishments and worked hard to provide for her family in all things. As the first African American employed by the Social Security Office in 1964, she paved the way for others. In July 2003, she was inducted into the KY Civil Rights Hall of Fame for being such a pillar of the community, proving that Ms. Peggy was smart and a source of knowledge to her community.

She was an active member of Broadway Missionary Baptist Church where she was Church Trustee and financial officer, making sure that the church ran smoothly. She continued to be active in Sunday School and Worship Services until her health deteriorated.

Peggy was a long-time member of Golden Link Temple 123, where she was a member since 1961 and had served as the Daughter Ruler for 30+ years. Upon her retirement she received the honor of State President Emeritus. Peggy was appointed Grand District Deputy for Bluegrass Temple 72 which she served faithfully until her death.

Peggy was a member of Allen Chapter #18, Order of the Eastern Star for over 25 years. She served Worthy Matron and various other positions and was currently serving as the treasurer. She enjoyed traveling to the Eastern Star workshops when health permitted.

She leaves to cherish her memories her grandchildren Fenicia Seals, Gregcola Seals, Gregory Seals Jr., and Kayla Hampton; a special cousin, Charles Embry, adopted son, Tim Nance, a special friend, Ruthanne Dobbins, and a caretaker, Michelle Hooten. She will be missed by her great-grandchildren, Elk famiy, friends and colleagues.
