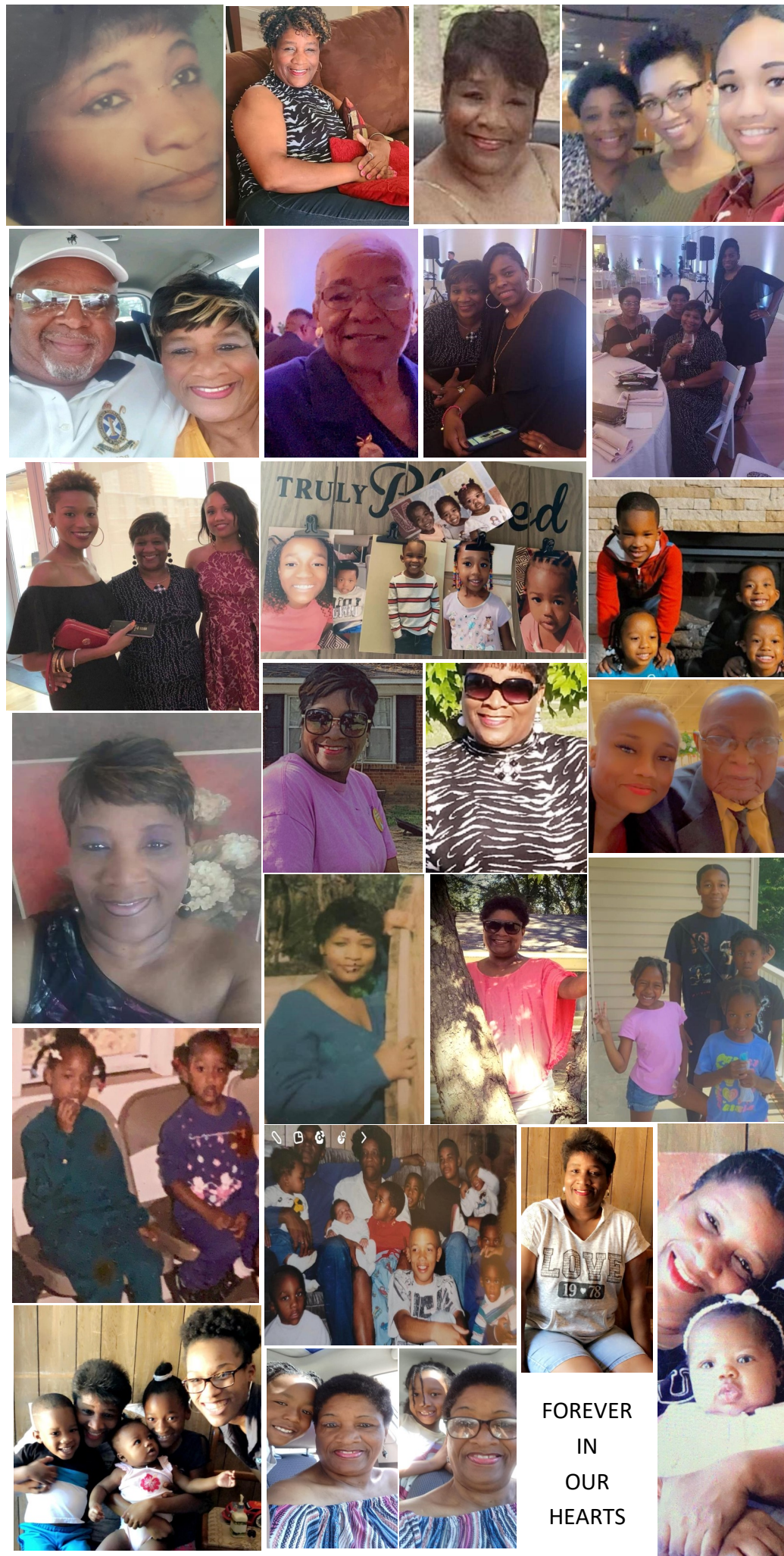

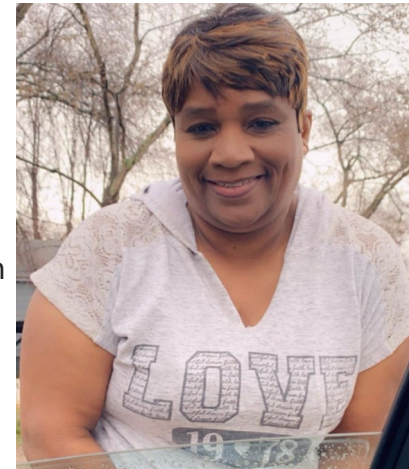


Caroline L. Moten
