

A Beautiful Life Remembered

Emmanuel Earl Goode, Jr. 85, passed away Monday, August 5, 2024.

Earl, the second of seven children, was born to the Emmanuel and Grace Goode on October 10, 1938 in Bessemer City, NC. "June" as he was affectionately called, by many family and friends.

Upon his 1956 graduation from Lincoln High School, Earl joined the United States Air Force and served for 23 years, reaching the Rank of Master Sergeant. After retirement, he was employed by the Washington DC Metro Transit Authority for 19 years.
