LIFE JOURNEY

Jason Fowler was born on September 12, 1961, in Detroit, Michigan. He grew up watching his parents, Willie Fowler and Sonja Fowler, serve as beacons of compassion, resilience, and generosity within their community.

Jason graduated from Cass Tech High School in 1979 and Michigan State University in 1983 and proudly carried the spirit of the Spartans with him wherever life led. Through faith, perseverance, and determination, he dreamed of one day building a loving family, becoming a leader in his community, and creating opportunities not only for himself, but for others as well.

Jason's career began at Enterprise Rent-A-Car. In time, he became one of the first African American GM/VPs within Enterprise Rent-A-Car, overseeing operations throughout Rhode Island and parts of Massachusetts.

Jason served on the United Way of Rhode Island Community Advisory Board, was a member of the Urban League Society and the NAACP (lifetime member), where he received the Outstanding Community Service Award for his advocacy and community initiatives. He was appointed to the Board of Directors for the Providence Warwick Convention and Visitors Bureau and dedicated countless hours to uplifting the communities he loved.

Wisdom shaped the family life he and his beloved wife, Patricia Copeland Fowler, built together. Early in their relationship, Jason and Patricia shared not only dreams, but discipline and vision. Through prayer, perseverance, and God's grace, Jason and Patricia were blessed with three wonderful children and a loving marriage.

He is survived by his wife of 38 years, Patricia Copeland Fowler of Belmont, NC; children, Jordan Moriah Fowler of Honolulu, HI, Jason Montgomery Fowler II., and Joshua March Fowler of Belmont, NC. He also leaves to cherish his memory, mother Sonja Fowler of Arlington, TX; sister, Jamie Ross of Arlington, TX; along with other family, friends and colleagues, too numerous to name. He was preceded in death by his father Willie Fowler.

The seeds Jason planted will continue to grow in every life touched by his kindness, wisdom, mentorship, faith, and unwavering love.
