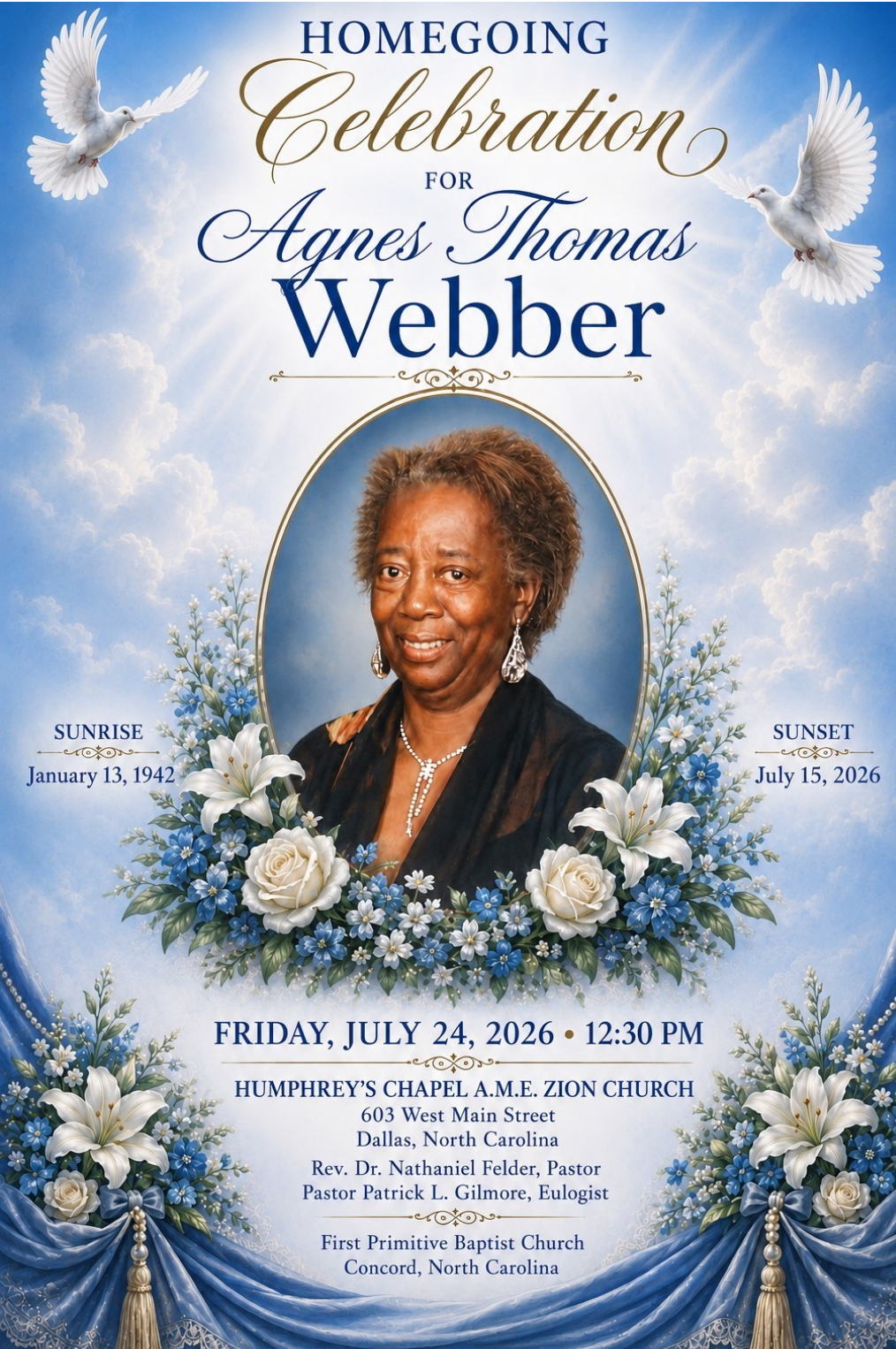

OBITUARY

Agnes Thomas Webber, age 84, was born on January 13, 1942, and entered into eternal rest on Wednesday, July 15, 2026, at Morningside of Gastonia Assistant Living & Memory Care. She was the daughter of the late Ernest and Lossina Thomas.

Agnes lived a life marked by faith, service, dedication, and love for others. She was a graduating member of Reid High School Class of 1960 Belmont, NC and continued her education at Sacred Heart Junior College Belmont, NC. On January 9, 1964, she was united in marriage to the late Horace Costello Webber. Their loving union lasted 42 years and was a testament to commitment and partnership. After over 25 years of service, Agnes retired from the North Carolina State Agricultural Extension Food and Nutrition Department, Raleigh, NC. Serving families and citizens of Gaston and Cleveland Counties, her work reflected her commitment to helping others and strengthening her community.

Agnes remained deeply rooted in her faith throughout her life. In 1981 she received recognition by the Charlotte District Lay-Council of the Western NC Conference for faithful service rendered. In 1989 she was constituted a Life Member of the Women's Home and Overseas Missionary Society of the A.M.E. Zion Church. Agnes's church affiliations included Jerusalem Baptist Church, Trinity A.M.E. Zion Church, and Humphrey's Chapel. where She faithfully sang in the hymn choir at Jerusalem Baptist Church and served as a deaconess at Trinity A.M.E. Zion Church.

Agnes Webber was a member of her local Neighborhood Community Watch organization and helped to advance community engagement and neighborhood safety. Agnes also created and transformed herself as religious comedienne "Miss Aggie" and performed for church affairs, family reunions, school alumni associations and more. Although she had no children of her own, Agnes made an immeasurable impact on the lives of her young nieces, nephews, and cousins. She delighted in exposing them to new experiences, often taking them on trips, outings, and educational adventures.

Preceding her in death were her parents, Ernest Thomas and Lossina Gilmore Thomas, and her beloved husband, Horace Costello Webber. She leaves to cherish her precious memories a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, other relatives, and dear friends.

Agnes enjoyed life to the fullest. She valued family, friendship, fellowship, and service. Her warm spirit, leadership, and willingness to invest in others will be remembered by all who were blessed to know her.
