You caught me when I fell.

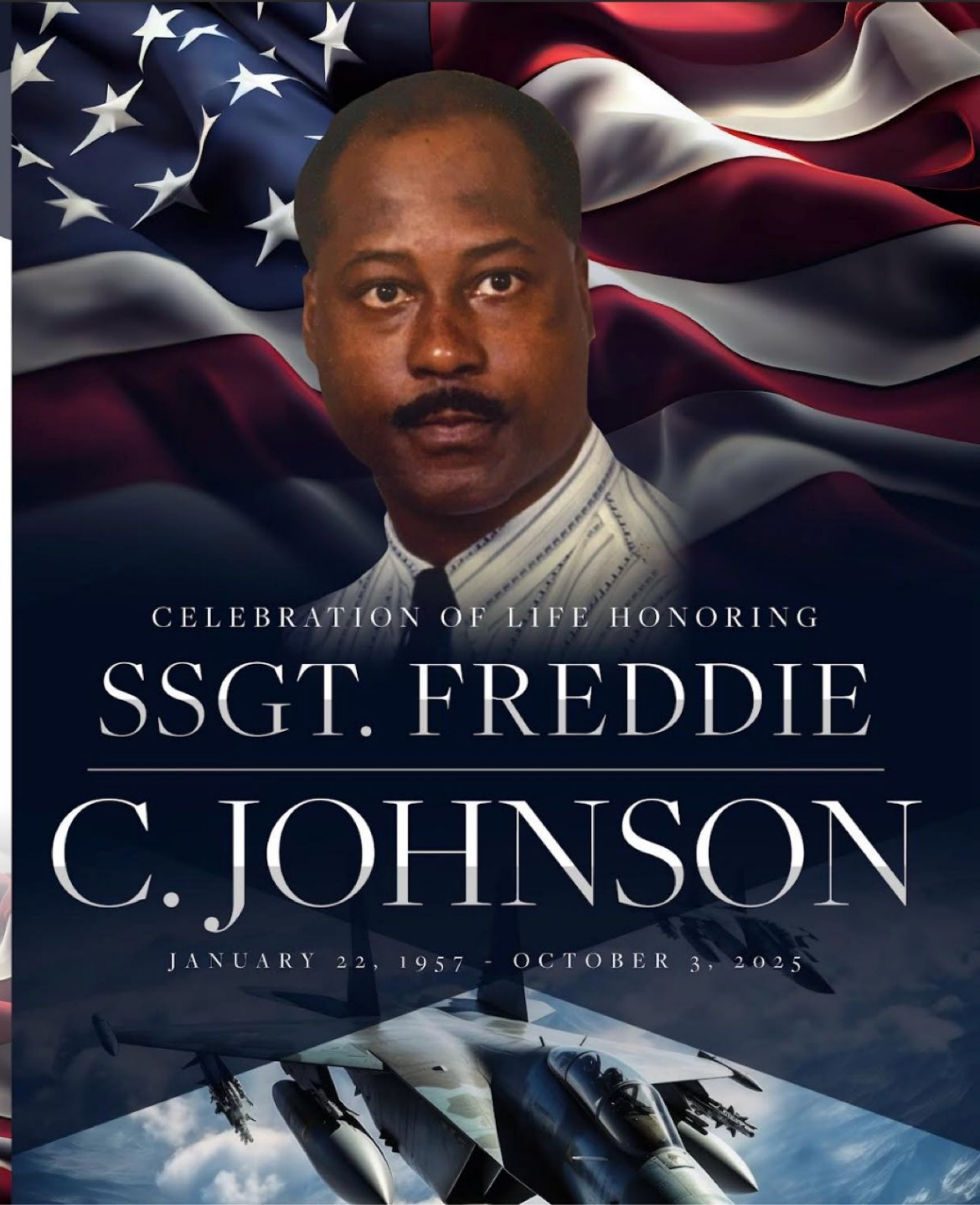
The hero of my childhood and of latter

Mr. Freddie C. Johnson, 68 was called to be with his Lord and Savior on October 3, 2025. He was born on January 22, 1957 to the late Deacon Rufus Johnson, Sr. and Lovie Lee Johnson.

Freddie lovingly known as “Skeet” attended the Muscogee County School System. He graduated from Jordan Vocational High School in Columbus, Georgia in 1975. Following high school, Freddie went on to pursue his first career as a self proclaimed chef - working as a cook at Walgreens before joining the United States Air Force in 1981. Freddie worked in the 325th Security Forces Squadron. While on military duty stationed at Robins Air Force Base, Freddie met and married the late Sandra Dixon Johnson on May 26, 1984.

In 1991, Freddie and Sandra welcomed their only child, Keyonna Johnson while stationed in Panama City, Florida.

In 1993, after 15 years of service, Freddie retired from the USAF with the rank of Ssgt. Freddie received several decorations and honors at retirement, such as Airforce Outstanding Unit Award, Air Force Good Conduct Medal with two Oak Leaf Clusters, National Defense Service Medal, Air Force Overseas Service Long Tour Ribbon, and lastly the Air Force Longevity Service Award with two Oak Leaf Clusters.

After Air Force retirement, Freddie went on to work for the United States Postal Service as an Automation Clerk where he worked for 19 years before his retirement in 2019.

Freddie was a devoted Husband, Father, Grandfather, Brother, and Friend. He is survived by his devoted daughter and only child, Keyonna Johnson; two devoted granddaughters, Kariyah Janae’ Dezurn and Aubrielle Ja’Liyah Dezurn; brother, Rufus Johnson, Jr.; sisters, Betty Howard and Connie Williamson; sisters-in-law, Ernestine Dixon, Dianne Jackson, and Louise Belvin; brothers-in-law, Michael Dixon, Timothy Dixon, Jr., and Joseph Dixon, Jr; special niece, Christine Howard-Poindexter.
