

Retired Master Sergeant (MSG/E-8) Joseph H. Miles Sr. was born December 22, 1947 in Suffolk, Virginia to Williams T. Miles Sr. and Vernie D. Cooper. He departed this earthly life at age 75, on Tuesday, November 21, 2023, in Charlie Norwood VA Medical Center in Augusta, GA. After being drafted into the United States Army in 1965, he later graduated from high school and proceeded to fight in the Vietnam War. He furthered his education in the military and earned degrees as a German Headstart and Drill Sergeant Instructor Trainer. Additionally, Joseph received numerous decorations, medals, badges, ribbons and awards for his service to include: National Defense Service Medal, Good Conduct Medal (seven awards), Vietnam Service Medal with two Bronze stars, Vietnam Campaign Medal with sixty device, Vietnam Cross of Gallantry with Palm//2 O/S bars, Meritorious Service Medal, NCO Professional Development Ribbon, Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon, Army Commendation Medal, and the German Army Marksmanship Award in Silver, Bronze and Expert (Rifle). After retiring from the United States Army of twenty-three years, Joseph embarked on another career at Savannah River Site for three years. His hobbies included working on cars, playing and listening to music, fishing and cooking. He was a member of the Masonic Lodge and American Legion.

Preceding him in death were: his parents, William T. Miles Sr. and Vernie C. Miles; sister, Yvonne Martin; and great grandson, Aavery Jones.
