Hen Life Reflections


**VALERIA "VAL" MARY BROWN**, 75, of Augusta, GA, passed away peacefully on November 30, 2023, after a brief illness. Valeria was born on September 13, 1948, to Henry Charles Brooks Sr. and Mary Louise Brooks in Augusta, GA. She received her Christian faith at an early age at Good Shepherd Baptist Church under the pastoral leadership of Rev. Essie Mae McIntyre, where she would remain a resolute member throughout her life serving as a Trustee, Sunday School Teacher and on the Bus Ministry.

Valeria graduated from T.W. Josey High School in 1966. She went on to study Sociology at Albany State University. While at Albany State, Valeria pledged Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Incorporated, and Delta Rho Chapter in the spring of 1969. She was number two on a line of seven Pyramids pledging and was dedicated to attaining her place in the sisterhood. She will forever be remembered and remain in the hearts of her line sisters. After retirement, she continued to serve as a substitute teacher in the Richmond County Public School System. Valeria cherished spending time with her family, extended family, and friends. She enjoyed listening to gospel music, reading, and watching marathons of "Blue Bloods." She was smart, witty, and introspective. The pride and joy of her life were her two boys Roderick and Ronzo, granddaughters, Aeriel and Imari; nieces, Valeria "Lil Val" (Isaiah, Raven, and Elijah) and Farrah Moore (Alyssa, Alexis); great-great niece, Zamiyah.

Valeria was affectionately known as "Mama Val" by many of the neighborhood kids. Her heart and door were always open to the community. Throughout her life she made many true and lifelong friends. She lived and loved, authentically, affectionately, and unconditionally. When you think of Val, celebrate the good memories you have of her.
