Lizzie Mae Bogan Barnes' Journey of Life

Lizzie Mae Bogan Barnes was born Saturday, September 8, 1951 to J.B. Bogan and Mary Catherine Toney Bogan in Mize, Smith County, MS.

She joined Dry Ridge Church in Mize, MS and later joined Mount Pisgah Missionary Baptist Church in Raleigh, MS at an early age. Lizzie graduated from Turner Chapel High School and after graduating, she began working at Raleigh Corporation in Raleigh, MS until she became ill.

Lizzie was united into Holy Matrimony to Roy Lee Barnes, and to this union, God blessed them with six children which consisted of five sons and one daughter.

Along with Bro. Jufus McCullum, she started the youth choir at Mount Pisgah Missionary Baptist Church. She was also instrumental in establishing the gospel group, The Golden Angels. At Mount Pisgah, she was a member of the Mission Society, the Rainbow Tea, and head of the Kitchen Committee.
