Mrs. George Dell Page of Raleigh, Mississippi, peacefully departed this life on February 27, 2026.

Mrs. Page was born on September 14, 1937, in Mississippi, to George Alton Sims and Mae Bell Sims of Raleigh, Mississippi. She was the eldest of seven children and lovingly carried the role of the oldest sister among five sisters and one brother. From an early age, she was known for her strength, caring spirit, and deep love for her family.

She was united in Holy Matrimony to the late Charlie Page. From this union, three children were born: Charlie Lee Page, Ina Mae Keyes, and Jimmy Dale Page. She was also blessed with a daughter, Linda Page Lee. Later in life, she lovingly opened her heart and home to an adopted daughter, Diamond Page.

George Dell was a faithful and devoted member of Mt. Pisgah Missionary Baptist Church. She served faithfully as President of the Usher Board and was also a member of the Heroines of Jericho. Now carries forward her endless light.*





