Miss Yvonne Ingram. Who was she? Born to the late Richard and Winnie Mae Ingram, on October 16, 1957, she was many things: A beloved sibling of seven, a friend to many past and present who welcomed her countenance, a beloved aunt, and was affectionately known by her family and friends as Von. She was also cherished by her spiritual brothers and sisters, being a member of the worldwide Association of Jehovah's Witnesses, as well as her home congregation here in Americus, Georgia. She was educated in the public school system in Preston Georgia. She attended Ida S. Lowery Elementary School, and graduated from Webster County High School, Preston, Georgia in 1975. During her high school years, she was a point guard on the girl's varsity basketball team. She completed her certification in office management after high school at South Georgia Technical College.

As proof of her dedication to her God, Jehovah, she made a public declaration by being baptized as one of Jehovah's Witnesses on November, 22nd 1975.

Cherishing her role in the congregation as a publisher of the "Good News of God's kingdom", for some time, she served as a "pioneer" in her local congregation, a full-time minister of Jehovah. In later years, although confined to a wheelchair, she continued to serve Jehovah by witnessing to all who she came in contact with. She was a beautiful person inside and out, and we will truly miss her. One of her favorite scriptures used as screensaver for her computer touted her faith in God. It is taken from 2 Corinthians 4:16-18, and describes the particular condition that she

was experiencing. It says, "therefore we do not give up but even if the man we are outside is wasting away, certainly the man we are inside is being renewed from day to day. For though the tribulation, is momentary and light it works out for us as a glory that is more and more surpassing greatness and is everlasting; while we keep our eyes not on the things seen, but on the things unseen. For the things seen are temporary, but the things unseen are everlasting."

Yes, she truly believed that Jehovah God, will soon use his mighty power to restore life to the dead, including her own.
