

WIllie James, "Brother," departed this life Friday, January 10, 2025, at Phoebe Putney Memorial Hospital of Albany, Georgia.


He was preceded in death by his parents, Jessie and Sallie Mae Barnes; and three sisters, Annie Lee, Betty Davis, and Geneva Marshall.
