Reverend John Henry Walker, Sr. (affectionally known as "Rev") was born March 21, 1943 to the late Rev. Dolphus Walker Sr. and the late Mrs. Roberta Knighton Walker in Dougherty County, Georgia. Rev. Walker married Dorothy Ellis. This union was blessed with four beautiful children.

Rev. Walker attended schools in the Dougherty County School System and was a proud graduate of Monroe High School Class of 1963 where he played football. At a young age, Rev became a member of Arcadia Missionary Baptist Church. He later joined Third Kiokee Baptist Church where he was a faithful member until his decline in health. Rev served in many capacities. One of his favorites was singing in the choir. He was particularly known for the song "Peace Be Still".

Rev's career spanned several jobs - he was an orderly at Phoebe Hospital, a mechanic at Aero Commanders and later, a manager at The Albany and Macon Times Newspaper. Rev was called to serve in the ministry as a young adult. His philosophy was that your word is your bond. If you said it, mean it, do it. Rev had a humble spirit full of gratitude. He was grateful for EVERYTHING. If you visited him - thank you, if you called - thank you, if you turned him - thank you, if you shaved him - thank you. Whatever it was - he was thankful, and you knew it because he told you - always thanking you, always thanking Jesus. Lastly, daddy was always "wonderful". For someone bedridden and dependent on the aid of others, he never has a sad spirit. He was always wonderful. If he said anything else, it was time to dial 911. His precious memories will be with us forever.
