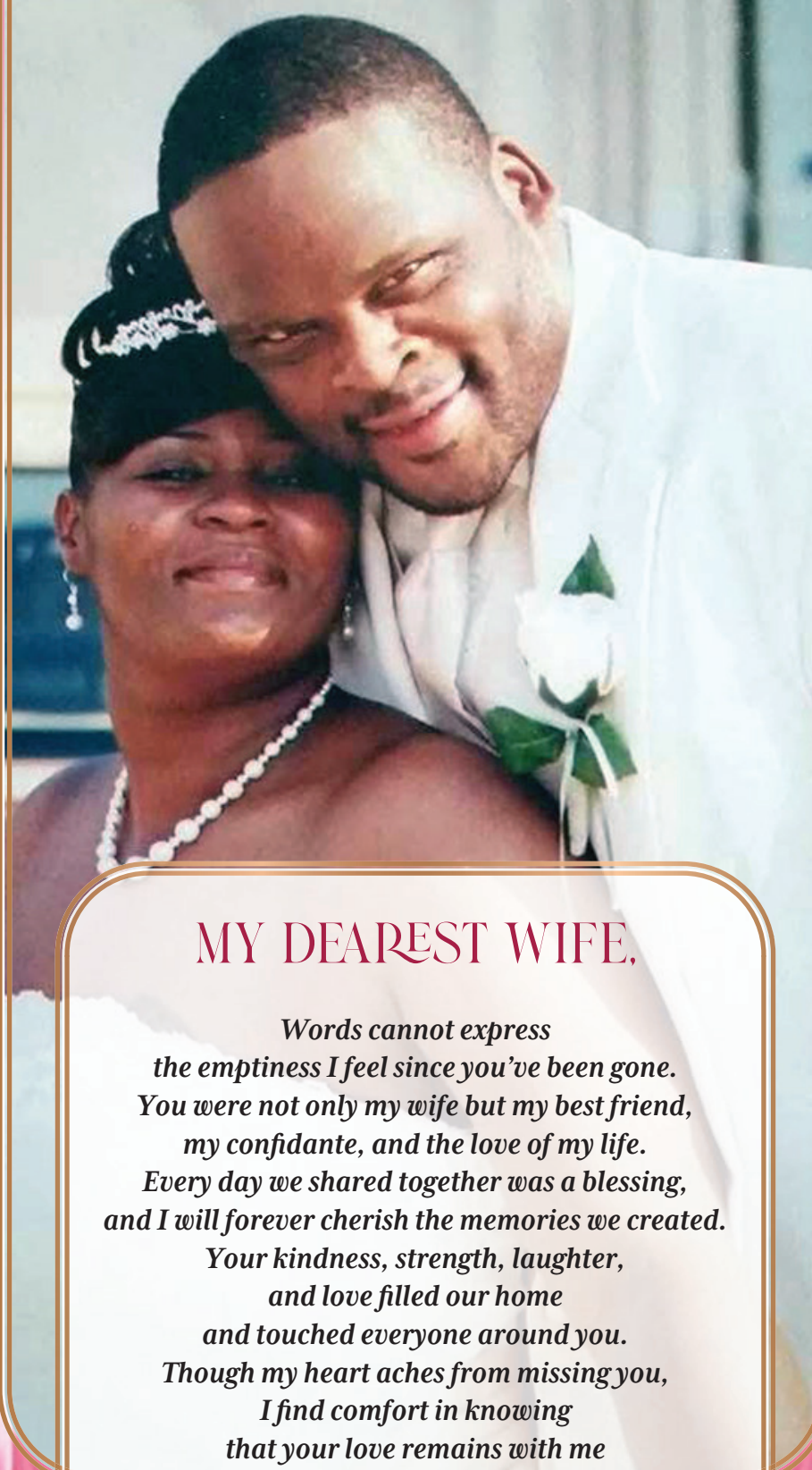
In her early years, India was educated in the Dougherty County school system and received her high school diploma from Southwest Georgia Institute of Education.
