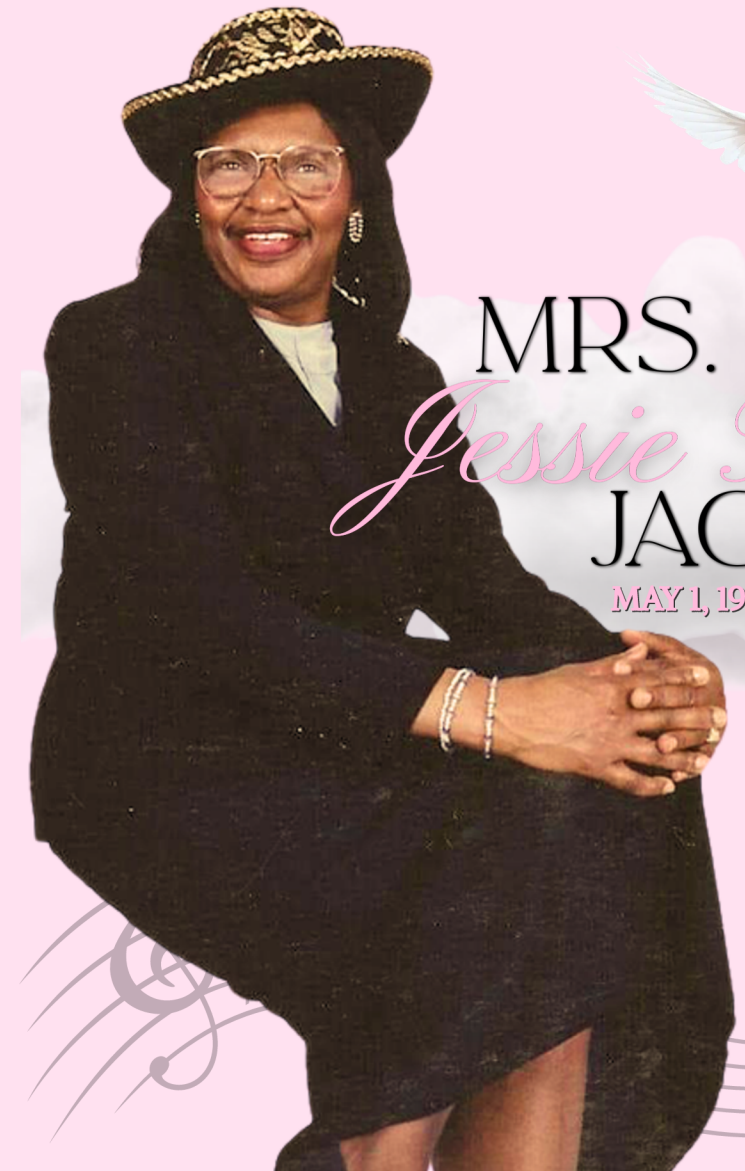

Jessie was presently a member of Emmanuel Life and Worship Center under the leadership of Bishop Billy B. Avery. Jessie was a self made Beautician. She was a former member of Greenwood Missionary Baptist Church as well as the musician. She was baptized by the Late Rev. Cornelius Booker. Love Union was her first love for many years.

On May 1, 1943, a bouncing baby girl was born to Jesse and Ada, the name “Jessie” was given to her. Jessie was a Mother, Granny, Sister, Aunt and Friend. The Evanaires recorded a jingle for Six Flag over Georgia, “I Believe In People”. Jessie was a pianist for several area churches, far and near. Her resume of churches include: Greenwood MB Church, New Zion, Zion Rest, Rehobeth, Mt. Hermon, Bethlehem (West Point), Concord, Bethelpore, St. John (Cherry Drive), St. John (Crawford, Al), Community MB Church, Good Hope, Mt. Nebo (West Point). Jessie worked with various musicians throughout the Valley area, Myron Fears, Nathaniel “Nap” Williams, Linda Tibbs, Dot McClemore, and many others. She was a member of the Dixie Harmonizers. She also sang alongside Hattie Mae Marshall, Faye Jackson, Dorothy Ruth Benton and Irelia B. Magby.

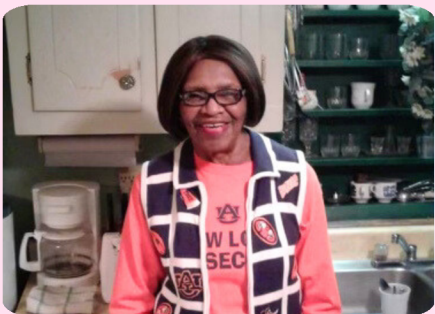
