Ann confessed Christ at an early age and became a faithful member of Mt. Calvary Missionary Baptist Church where she served faithfully until her health no longer allowed.


She married the late Napoleon Barker and to this union three children were born. Ann was not only a great mother to her children, but Ann was also a "Mother" in her neighborhood.
