In Newberry County, on January 13, 1938, the late Mr. and Mrs. Eddie and Georgeanna Jeter were blessed with a child-a daughter, Frances. She grew up with three sisters and a brother, all of whom preceded her in death-Eddie Mae Jeter Cutler, Marie Jeter Davis, Ida Alice Jeter Hill and Reverend Charlie Geter.

Frances was educated in the Newberry and Laurens County Schools, and was a graduate of Bell Street High School in Clinton, SC.

Soon after high school graduation, she moved to Freeport Long Island, NY; where she met and married Mr. James Creech. She worked in housekeeping for families and later for hotels. Her last job in New York was caregiving at the Hebrew Home for the Aged in Freeport.

At an early age, she became a member of Mount Zion AME Church in Joanna, SC. She enjoyed attending all types of church services. In New York, she became a loyal member of The Greater Second Baptist Church of Freeport where she sometimes served as an usher. Upon returning to Clinton, SC to live during her later years, she joined Hebron Baptist Church and attended services often. She was a member of the Eastern Stars for many years and is still a member of the Women’s Aide Society.

She was a gregarious, fun-loving person. All who knew her loved her. Frances lived an exemplary life, was devoted to her family; and was especially loving and generous to her nieces and nephews. She was someone who would feed you if you were hungry, offer shelter if you needed it, offer excellent advise, and would tell you a funny joke if you came to her in sadness.
