### McKinley "Crown Prince" Williams -Alife welllived

McKinley "Crown Prince" Williams was born in Waynesboro, Georgia, as the only child to Mr.Fred Williams and Mrs. Selena Jones on August 4,1939. He graduated from Dillard High School in Ft. Lauderdale Florida in 1958. He attended the Midwestern Broadcasting Schools of Radio and TV Technology in Chicago and the RCA Institute in New York. McKinley "Crown Prince" Williams married Cynthia Joanna Cartwright on June 24,1967, in West Palm Beach, Florida. These two love birds were married for 56 years.

He worked as a Radio Disc Jockey in Houston, Texas and WMBM in Miami. He was employed by WRBD in Ft. Lauderdale Florida as sports director and afternoon disc jockey. He was affectionately known by his radio name "Crown Prince." He was heard Monday thru Friday from 3:00 pm until sign-off and on Saturday 6:00 am -12:00 pm saying: "You are in tuned to Crown the ruler of monarch sound. E-papadah, whoa this is the Crown, back on scene with the record machine, the correct time now is 3:15 pm." While at WRBD, he created a program for youth called "Teen Talk."

After his time at WRBD, McKinley "Crown Prince" Williams worked for Time Warner under the Atlantic Records label promoting the Rhythm and Blues for the State of Florida. He worked with recording artists such as Levert, Sister Sledge, Brandi, Al Green, Johnny Gill, Stacy Lattisaw, Pink Floyd, Kwame, YES, Twisted Sister, Led Zeppelin, AC/DC, The Drifters, Slave, Hall and Oats, Ray Charles, The Velvet Underground, and En Vogue just to name a few. Several of the recording artists that he promoted, such as Aaliyah, won Platinum Album from the Recording Industry Association of America for multi-platinum sales of more than 2 million copies. He received numerous awards of excellence from Atlantic Records Black Music Promotion.

McKinley "Crown Prince" Williams was a member of New Mount Olive Baptist Church. He served on the finance committee and supported the Radio Ministry. Moreover, he was a mentor to many young men in Ft. Lauderdale and Broward County such as Mr. Albert R. McWhite. He was a member of the Elks Club of Ft. Lauderdale and Big Brothers of America. He was kind, loving, and giving. He, Mr. Fred Benby, and Tylus Grant were instrumental in constructing a new weight room for Bethune Cookman Athletics as well as providing sweat suits for the Clark Atlanta University Football Team.

McKinley "Crown Prince" Williams enjoyed spending time with family, talking on the phone, listening to the Word of God, and calling all of his children, grandchildren, and great grand-children by their nick names that he gave them. He was a true fan of any sports team on which his children or grandchildren were playing on. They were and always will be his pride and joy.

McKinley "Crown Prince Williams" was preceded in death by father Fred Williams, mother and step-father Selena and Eugene Thomas, grandfather and grandmother Deacon Phil and Ida Mae Jones, father-in law and mother-in-law John and Rutha Mae Cartwright.
