

A few years later she moved back to Florida to take care of her dying sister the late Esther Rollins. After the passing of her sister her mother got ill and she decided to stay to help her in anyway she could.

Clairemin Cameron was a very loving caring person giving her all to those around her. She was kind-hearted and very generous. Everything she did had to be perfect making sure she did it to the best of her ability.
