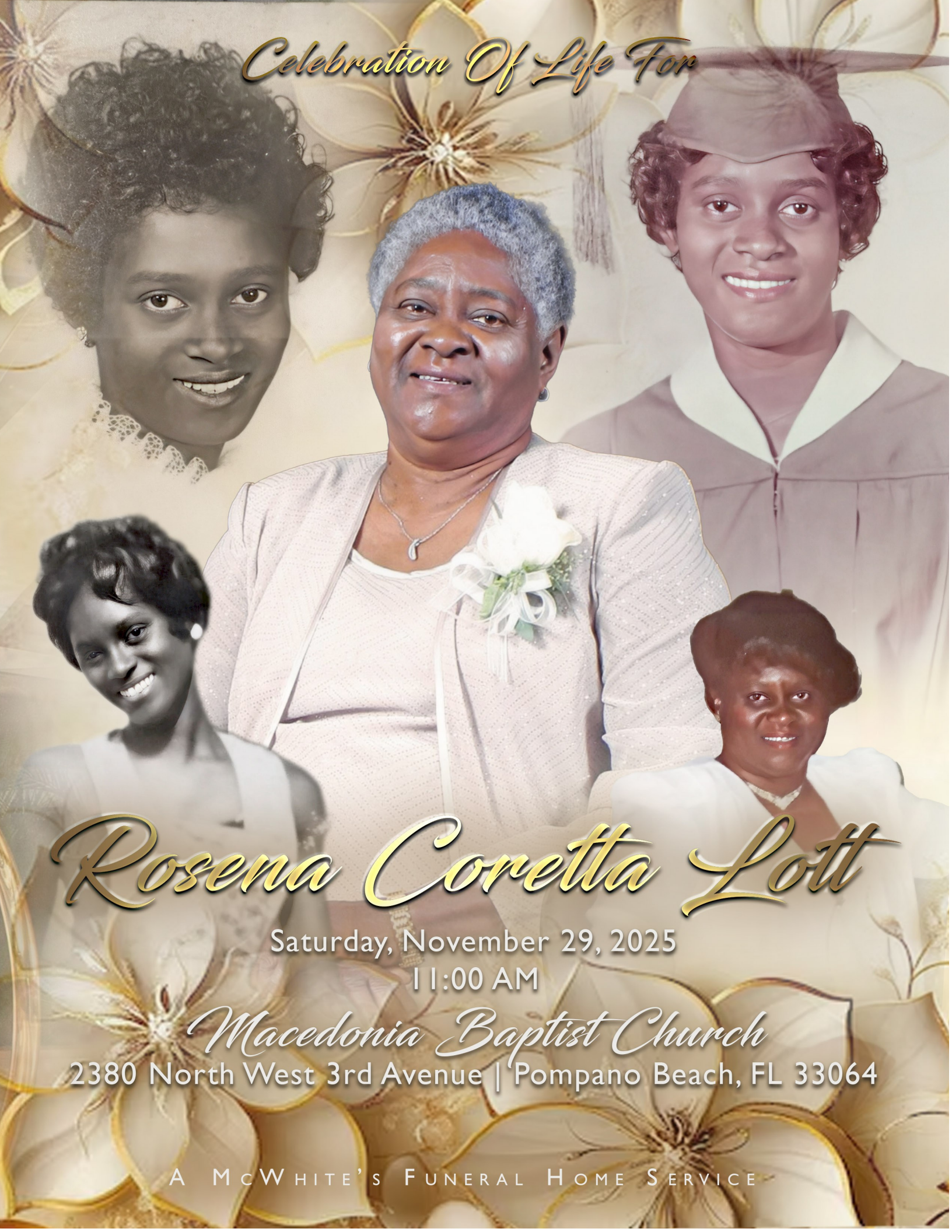

Rosena Coretta Coleman Lott

Was born on August 3, 1942, in Fort Lauderdale, Florida. She was the third child of five to Sarah Madison Brown and the only child of Abe Coleman. Rosena was raised by her maternal grandmother and her mother in Monticello, Florida. At age five, the entire family moved to Daytona Beach, where she would grow up. She would attend Bonner Elementary School and Campbell Street High School. While in the 11th grade, Rosena was excited to join the cheerleading team. This is where she would be introduced to traveling to different high schools for competitions.

After high school graduation, Rosena had the great opportunity to meet Ms. Mary McLeod Bethune. That meeting inspired her to want to attend Bethune-Cookman College (now University). She never got the opportunity to attend college.

She spent some time in New York with her eldest brother, David. She enjoyed her time in New York.

She returned home to Daytona Beach in the fall of 1963 and married her now deceased husband, Walter Lott. From that union in February 1966, their daughter, Wylodean C. Lott, was born.

She and her daughter moved to Fort Lauderdale in 1969, where she met some of her closest friends. These friends formed a tight-knit community and became like family to Rosena while she was far away from her own family in Daytona.

Years later, she met Edward Dollison, and they had a son, Erron L. Dollison.

Through one of her closet sister friends, Mary Butler, she became a lifelong tithing member of Macedonia Missionary Baptist Church, where she is affectionately known as Mother Lott. In Macedonia, Rosena sang in the choir; she was a faithful member of the Mission Ministry, the Pastor's Aid Ministry, and was devoted to the Sunday School Services. She has been a faithful member of Macedonia for 56 years.

She attended cosmetology and barbering school, becoming licensed in both disciplines. She also attended Broward Community College to pursue a degree in nursing. Although she did not complete her nursing degree, she did become a certified nursing assistant. She worked 23 years as a private duty aid on the night shift. After working many years at night, she transitioned to the day shift when she was hired as a paraprofessional for Plantation Park Elementary School.

Rose successfully owned and operated the businesses Cosmetology (Touch of Beauty) and Rosena Lott's Group Home while also working for the Broward School of Broward County as a paraprofessional.

Her love for traveling and adventure began in high school and continued throughout her life. Some of her travel experiences that she enjoyed were visiting different countries and multiple cities. She had the opportunity to feed and ride elephants in South Africa, a helicopter ride over Victoria Falls, Hula dancing in Hawaii, horseback riding in Alaska, and enjoy the beautiful island of Jamaica. Visiting Trevi Fountain in Rome, Italy, and admiring the Basilica de la Sagrada Familia, which is an unfinished church in Barcelona, Spain. Seeing the beautiful blue waters of several Caribbean Islands, Mexico, and riding under the San Francisco Bridge, snow tubing in New Hampshire, and taking cruises to various countries.

Rosena had a special love for community, which led her to join several organizations such as the Pride of Fort Lauderdale Temple No. 395, Daughters of IBPOEW, KAZAH Court No. 117, ELISHA Court No. 6, and Ladies of the Circle of Perfection, The Northwest Federated Women's Club of Broward County, The Order of The Golden Circle, Southeastern Association of Colored Women's Clubs, Inc. and Youth Affiliates, and many others.

In 2008, she received an honor for Women of the Year. During the COVID-19 epidemic, she would wait in food lines collecting groceries for her neighbors who were unable to get out themselves. Then she would deliver them to each neighbor.

In June of 2024 she was honored in the Broward Senior Hall of Fame.
