Ulysses Jenkins, Jr. was born in Ft. Lauderdale, Florida on August 21, 1961, to Deacon Ulysses Jenkins, Sr. and Pastor Mary Deas Jenkins.

“Bones” or “Len” as he was referred to, was well loved by his family and friends, and was known to light up a room with his outgoing personality.

Len was a product of the Broward County School System, graduating from South Plantation High School, where he played sports and was a member of the Mathematics Club.

He worked for many years in the Construction & Engineering industry, with his father, and excelled at using the gifts and talents he had in this area. He was instrumental in changing the face of many of our churches and homes. He was also known for his cooking skills.

He was united in holy matrimony to the “Late” Damita Curry, and to this union was born a son, Ulysses Jenkins III (“Snapper”) who also preceded him in death.

In his last days, Len suffered some health challenges, which God gave him the strength to contend with. But on November 14, 2025 the Lord called him home, subsequent to him rededicating his life to the Lord.

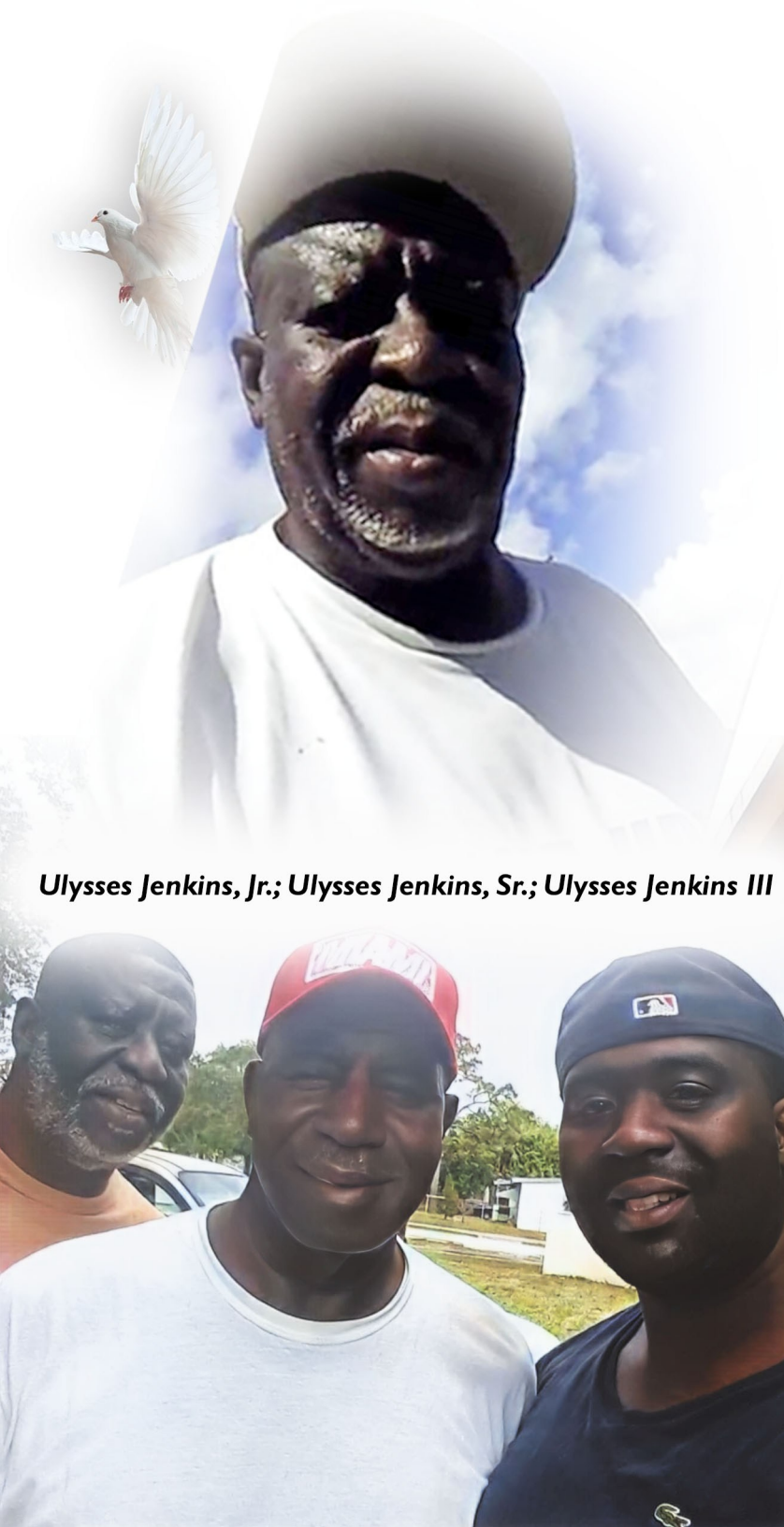
