

OBITUARY

Audley Philip Ramsay was born on April 29, 1940, in Belfont, St. James, Jamaica, to the late Ernil Ramsay and Beatrice Ramsay (Black). From his earliest days, his life was marked by resilience, purpose, and a quiet strength that carried him faithfully through every season.

As a young man Audley left Jamaica and embarked on an extraordinary journey that would carry him across nations and shape a life rich in meaning and accomplishment. His path first led him to the United Kingdom, where he met the love of his life, Jean Emily Parker of St. Catherine, Jamaica. United in marriage, they continued on to Toronto, Canada, and eventually made their home in Albany, New York, where he resided for more than five decades. During this remarkable chapter of his life, Audley achieved significant milestones, including earning his High School Equivalency Diploma through the University of the State of New York in 1987 and on February 24, 2006 proudly becoming a citizen of the United States Of America.



Audley now rests in eternal peace, reunited with his beloved parents and two siblings: his sister, Uda Ramsay, and his brother, Cecil "Doc" Ramsay. Their memories remain forever intertwined with his own.
