My life's been full; I've savored much

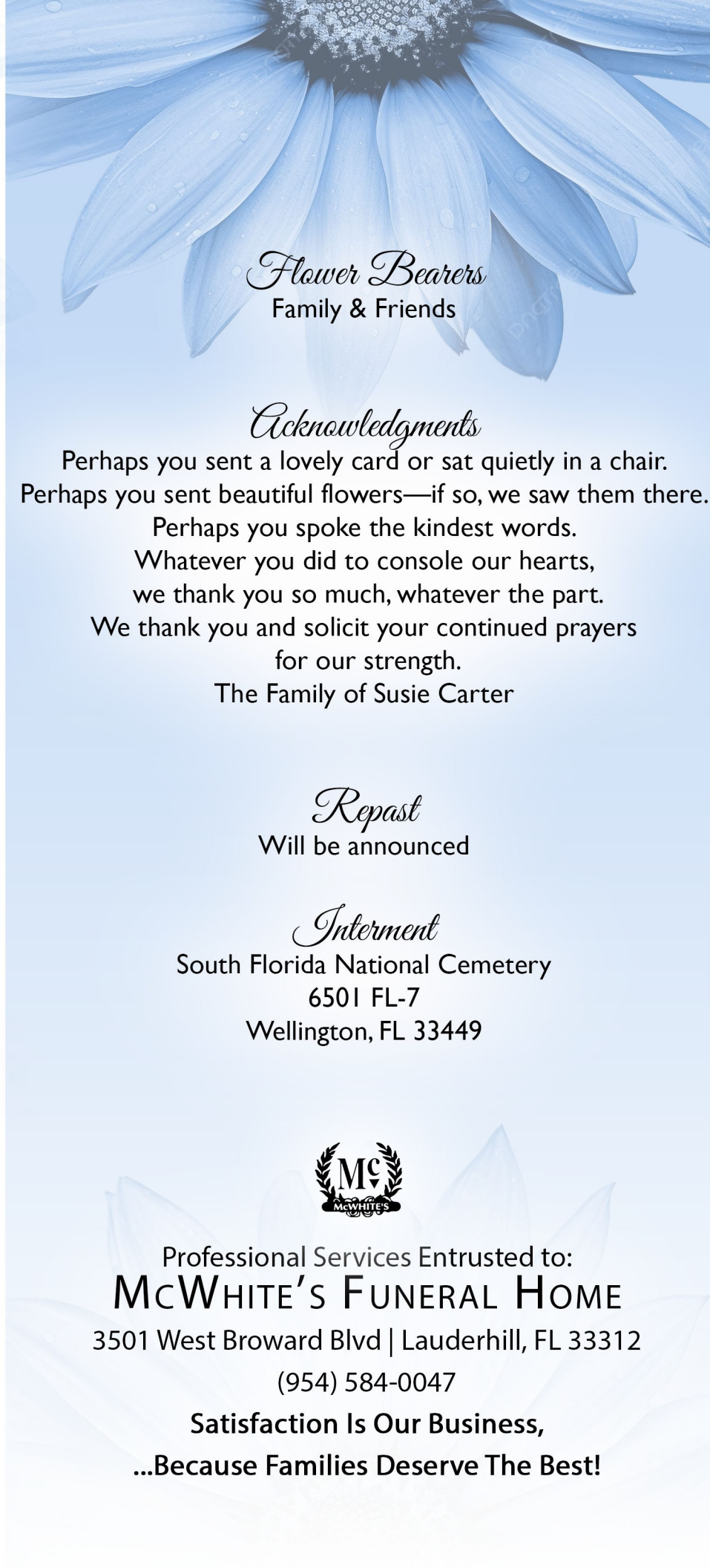
Good friends, good times, a loved one's touch.
