and oh...how he loved us all!*



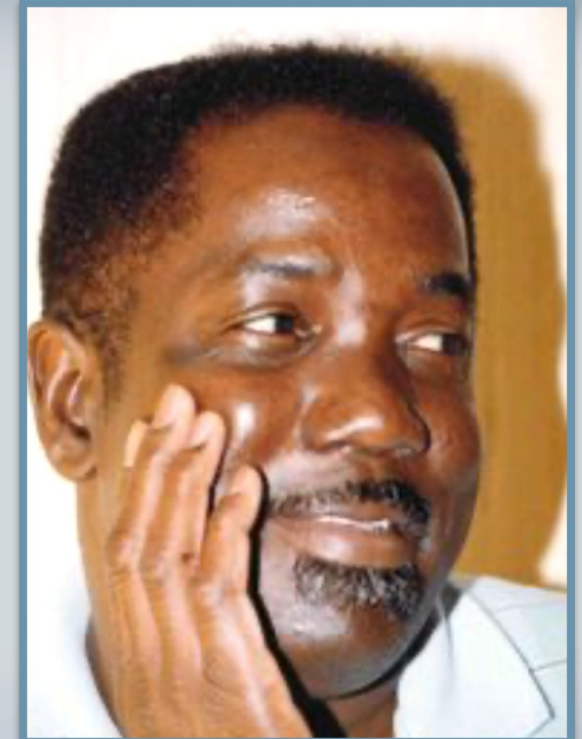
