

### Loving Reflections for Mr. Gary Alan Suttle

Mr. Gary Alan Suttle, a resident of Ringgold, Georgia, passed away on Friday, June 14, 2024, surrounded by his family. Born on June 10, 1947, he was the son of the late Joseph Perry Suttle, Sr., and Elzora Young Suttle. Gary was preceded in death by his seven brothers: Joseph Perry III, James, Lewis, Danny, Edwin, Chester, and Alvin Suttle, as well as two sisters, Mary Hinton and Karen Suttle.

Gary married the love of his life, Patricia Ann Woods Suttle. He proudly served in the United States Army during the Vietnam Conflict and received an Honorable Discharge. After twenty-eight years of dedicated service, he retired from the U.S. Postal Service. Gary was a faithful member of Mt. Zion Baptist Church in LaFayette, Georgia, where he actively served on the Usher Board and Missionary Society.

His compassionate spirit extended beyond the church walls. Gary found joy in visiting nursing homes, cutting hair, and offering inspirational words to residents. He also enjoyed traveling, gardening, grilling, and volunteering at Wallace A. Smith Elementary School. His kindness extended to helping his mother-in-law with odd jobs.

During his military service, Gary received several awards, including the Vietnam Campaign Medal with Device 60, the Vietnam Service Medal with 2 Bronze Service Stars, and the Combat Infantryman Badge. He was also recognized with an "ATTABOY" certificate for his work as a postman.

Survivors include his loving and devoted wife of fifty-seven years, Patricia Ann Woods Suttle of Ringgold, Georgia; his sister, Charlotte White of LaFayette, Georgia; sisters-inlaw Mary Rowland of Chattanooga, Tennessee, Mary Suttle of LaFayette, Georgia, and Marion Suttle of Atlanta, Georgia; along with numerous nieces, nephews, cousins, other relatives, friends, and his church family.
