On October 26, 2024, Amos laid all his burdens down and went home to rest in the arms of his loving heavenly father. Amos Perry, Jr., affectionally known to family and friends as “Brother”, “Uncle Bra”, “Unc”, or “Papa P”. Amos Perry, Jr. was born to the union of the late Amos Perry, Sr. and Leola Connley Perry on December 30, 1943, in Floyd County, Georgia. He was preceded in death by both loving parents, devoted wife, Charlotte Pollard Perry, daughter, Dr. Audrey Perry Woullard, sisters Mary Perry Reese Curtis, Dixie Lee Perry, Betty Simmons, and Christella Crawford, and brother James Connley.

Mr. Amos primary education began in and around Chattooga, and Gordon counties. After graduating from Stevenson High School- Calhoun, Georgia Amos enlisted into the United States Army. Mr. Amos collectively served 20+ years in the United States Army (SSG E-6) and was a Vietnam War Vet. Residing internationally and domestically in the following locations: Germany, Fort Dix, New Jersey, and Fort Campbell, Kentucky before permanently calling Summerville, Georgia home. Lifelong memories were created during this time, seeing different places and learning an array of different cultures, along with developing lifelong friendships. After retirement from the United States Army, Amos was employed with Pliant Corporation, formerly known as Huntsman Film in Calhoun, Georgia where he also retired. Amos also worked for the United States Postal Service, and in the Chattooga County School System after his second retirement.

Mr. Amos became a member of Friendship Baptist Church (Calhoun, Georgia) at an early age. After calling Summerville, Georgia home he became a faithful, and lifelong member of Hemphill AME Zion Church.

During his time in service, Amos married his wife the late Charlotte Pollard Perry (D. July 9, 2021) on November 19, 1968. The loving couple were married for 53 years. In 1990, their union was blessed with their pride and joy, Porscha who they loved with all their heart. The couple instilled life values that would prepare her for the world. Experiences from family trips, and endless conversations have created fond memories.

In 2022, Mr. Amos permanently relocated to the Washington, DC area to live with his daughter, Porscha. Mr. Amos hobbies and interests included: Cooking, traveling, crossword puzzles, watching westerns on tv, military conversations, spade games, and watching the Cleveland Browns.
