


#### Mr. Tommie Will Hardson

From Labor: May 7, 1947 To Reward: February 27, 2025

Mr. Tommie Will Hardson passed away on Thursday, February 27, 2025. He was born on May 7, 1947, to his late parents, Willie B., Sr. and Mattie Lois Allen Hardson, in Morris, Georgia. He was also preceded in death by his brothers, Willie B. Hardson, Jr. and James Albert "Bay" Hardson, as well as his twin sisters, Lillie Mae Hardson and Ethel Mae Hardson.

Mr. Hardson proudly served as a paratrooper in the United States Army's 82nd Airborne Division. After training at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, and Fort Benning, Georgia, he was deployed to Vietnam in December 1965, where he became one of the most highly decorated soldiers of the war, earning numerous medals for his service from 1965 to 1966. Following his Honorable Discharge, he pursued a long career as a truck driver.

Tommie had many passions, including piloting private aircraft and accounting. He was certified to fly both single and twin-engine planes and earned a certificate in accounting. A devoted member of Mt. Peria Baptist Church, he served faithfully as a Deacon and lent his voice to the Mt. Peria Male Chorus. He also enjoyed traveling, going on cruises, and spending time with friends. Known for his warm smile and kind personality, Tommie never met a stranger, and his friendships were countless.
