The year was 1944 and the world was in chaos. World War II was raging and life was less than desirable for so many. But for Mr. J.M. Facin & his wife, Ruthell Johnson Facin, there was a glimmer of hope. They were anticipating the birth of a baby. This child would be their third and would complete their family unit. On Sunday, May 7th in Cassville, Georgia, they welcomed their baby girl Hattie Marion Facin. Being the baby of the family she was spoiled by her parents and her two older sisters. May was a special month for the Facin family. Not only was Mr. J. M. Facin's Birthday in May (1st), but now all three of his children had been born in that same month; Ruth Ann (10th), Helen (3rd), and Hattie (7th).

As a child growing up in the small community of Cassville, Hattie was surrounded by love. Neighbors like the Beavers family, the Gainor family the Wheeler family, and the Jewell family were not merely just people who resided in the same area. They were family. They were a village.

It is in that same community that she received her education from Noble Hill School. Built in 1923, the school was a "Rosenwald School" constructed with funds through a partnership between Julius Rosenwald, a Jewish-American businessman who was part-owner of Sears, Roebuck and Booker T. Washington, who was an African-American educator and activist who was president and founder of Tuskegee Institute now known as Tuskegee University.

St. James AME Church was the place she received Christ. Though the church has dissolved in recent years, she was a proud member and spoke of it fondly throughout her life.

As a teenager Hattie met a handsome young man by the name of Thomas Howard Pullum. She was head over heels for him and he was swoon by her beauty and grace. They feel in love and were united in holy matrimony on July 16, 1960 at the home of the Justice of the Peace in Adairsville on Summer Street. To this union eight children were born; four boys & four girls.

Hattie was employed by the Bartow County School System and fed hundreds of children in the Adairsville lunchroom. She was also employed by Holiday Inn Hotel of Cartersville and Crown Craft of Calhoun, where she retired after 18 years.

She devoted her entire life to loving, raising, and nurturing her children, grand children, great-grand children, and even surrogates who were not her own. She loved her family.


