



Mr. Vernon Clayton Wright was born on September 13, 1952, in Wise County, Virginia, to Mary Beatrice Scales and Vernon Davis. He was preceded in death by his beloved mother, Mary Beatrice Scales Salters; father, Vernon Davis; grandmother, Meria Arelia Branch; grandfather, Rev. Leslie Scales; brother, Donnie Ray Salters; and step-grandfather, James Thomas Wright.
