Herman E. Langston Sr. passed away on Friday, February 27, 2026, at Memorial Hospital in Chattanooga, Tennessee. Born on June 10, 1952, he spent his entire life in Chickamauga. He attended high school in Rossville, Georgia, before enlisting in the United States Army at age 17, proudly serving his country. After completing his service, he returned home to Chickamauga to begin building his life and career.
