## The Life Journey of Mr. Lamar Charles Bonds "Breezer"

Lamar Charles Bonds was born on April 21, 1954, to the late Morris Bonds and Gladys (Pardlow) Bonds. He was raised in Dalton, Georgia, where he attended local schools and later graduated from Dalton High School, Class of 1972. He then attended Atlanta Area Technical School where he became a certified printer. Lamar was known by many as "Breezer," a nickname that perfectly captured his calm, cool, and laid back spirit.
