A call rang down from heaven from labor to reward. Someone answered..." I have fought a good fight, I have finished my course, I have kept the faith!" April 8, 2023, Sis. Mary Magdeline Duncan Beckett closed her eyes, and answered the Master's call.

She plowed, rode horses, was friendly and very quiet. 'Come See' didn't bother anyone.

"She was told by her father not to ride the mule because it was stubborn, only her oldest brother and father were the only ones to ride. "Come See" didn't care, she did it anyway. It would buck, but it never threw her off." *-Winnie*

On June 9, 1953, Mary was united in Holy Matrimony to Nathaniel Beckett. Six children were born to this union. Shortly thereafter, she moved to Jacksonville, Fl, on September 5, 1954.

Mary was multi-talented! She worked as a furniture maker, taught pottery at senior citizen centers, and she also did wood frame work. She was an amazing cook, most known for her sweets; namely, peach cobbler, blueberry dumplings, homemade candies and her famous biscuits, the neighborhood kids called "Hammerknockers."

She worked for many years as a cook and retired from Duval County Public Schools. After retirement, she went back to serve as a Foster Grandparent at various elementary schools in the county, and as a bus attendant.

One thing about Mary, her doors were ALWAYS OPEN!!! She provided shelter for many! She loved to dance, and Praise and Worship was what she did!

There were many people that answered the call from heaven before her. Her parents, James and Mamie Duncan, Brothers, Eldridge (Bub) and Eddie Duncan, Sisters, Florrie Duncan, and Jerry Duncan Floyd, and Sarah Lee Brooker; and a Daughter, Susie Virginia Beckett .
