Obituary

Rev. Kenneth David Kidd was born on September 17, 1964 to Sarah L. Kidd and the late C.D. Kidd III. He transitioned to his heavenly home on Monday November 27, 2023 at the age of 59.

David was a 1982 graduate of Jefferson High School and earned an Associate's Degree from the Art Institute of Atlanta in Music Business. David loved dancing and music. Once out of high school, not real sure of what he wanted to do with his love for music and dance, he recruited for and managed a dance crew called "The Bad Boys" who began to incorporate moves they picked up when the classic "Breakin" played in Athens theaters. In early 2000, he put the oxygen down and put his complete trust in God.

In addition to music and dance, Rev. Kidd loved fishing, reading God's word, preaching, and teaching Bible study. He was an inspiration to many who were called to do God's work and always saw the good in everyone. His book, "Why the Devil Don't Like You" was published in 2014. In 2016 David founded DK Ministries using this platform to continue to inspire others and those who were entering into the ministry. He was an encourager and had a true gift for connecting and bringing people together in the name of the Lord.

David married Tiffany Rucker in 1996 and to this union two beautiful children were born. Jeshua D'Andre and Courtney Keziah. More than music and dance, he loved God and his family.

Though he suffered from sickle cell anemia, Rev. Kidd never allowed the condition to stop him from living a full life. He was strong, courageous, and truly loved the Lord. He leaves to mourn his passing, his children, son Jeshua D'Andre (Courtney) Kidd, daughter Courtney Keziah Kidd, their mother, Tiffany Rucker Kidd, grandchildren, Liam, Lewis, Lukas, and Leina Kidd.
