Sandra was a constant source of strength for her children and husband, helping each one achieve their dreams through her encouragement and belief in their potential. She was the backbone of our family and the caregiver who approached every situation with prayer --

"Place it in the hands of the Lord."

Sandra leaves behind "The Matriarch" of our family, her mother, Mrs. Mamie Lee Carey Colquitt, as well as her beloved husband of over 54 years, Chief Joseph H. Lumpkin Sr., her "eighth-grade sweetheart."
