Immediately following the interment, the family will fellowship with relatives and friends in the church fellowship hall.



# Obituary

**Elder Hubren Shelley Davis, Jr.** was the son of the late Hubren Shelley Davis, Sr. and Bonzolar Walker Davis. He was born on March 8, 1932, in Savannah, Georgia. Hubren was summoned to eternal rest on July 16, 2024, at the Veterans Affairs Medical Center in Durham, NC.

He was educated in the public schools and graduated from A.E. Beach High School in Savannah, Georgia.

Hubren joined the Army and fought in the Korean War. After returning to the US, he attended Savannah State University. Hubren moved to New York and worked at the Brooklyn Navy Shipyard. He often reminded his family and friends that Allen Clayton Powell helped him gain employment at the U.S. Post Office. He was also proud that he had the opportunity to march with Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

After moving to New Jersey, Hubren was employed by All Right Pen Company where he met the love of his life, the Late Eldress Lucille Jones Davis. They shared forty-four years of holy matrimony and were blessed with four children, Kirk, Karl, Kris and Karen. The couple moved to North Carolina in 1973 and resided in Warren County. As a father, Hubren was very protective, loving, and stood on what he said.

Hubren accepted the "Call of God" and became a minister in 1981. Elder Davis was the Pastor of United Friendship Holy Church of Christ until his passing. He dedicated his life to serving the Lord and preaching God's word. He was known for his bold sermons and powerful testimonies. Elder Davis would often reference Mathew 5:48 "Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father who is in heaven is perfect".
