



Prophet John Thomas Williams, Jr. son of the late John T. Williams, Sr. and Cora L. Williams was born March 5, 1950 in Warrenton, North Carolina.

John graduated from Frederick Douglass High School in Baltimore, Maryland. Johns' passion was art, he loved all for art and was especially talented in drawing and wood crafting. He drew likeness of political and historical figures from Martin Luther King Jr to President Barack Obama. He was a great historian who absolutely loved learning as well as researching black history, biblical history and history in general. Even though he struggled with dyslexia from childhood his thirst for knowledge could not be denied.

John accepted Christ at an early age and became an ordained Deacon under the leadership of his older brother at Emmanuel Temple.
