At an early age; the family moved to Central Florida and took up residency in Lake Hamilton, Florida.

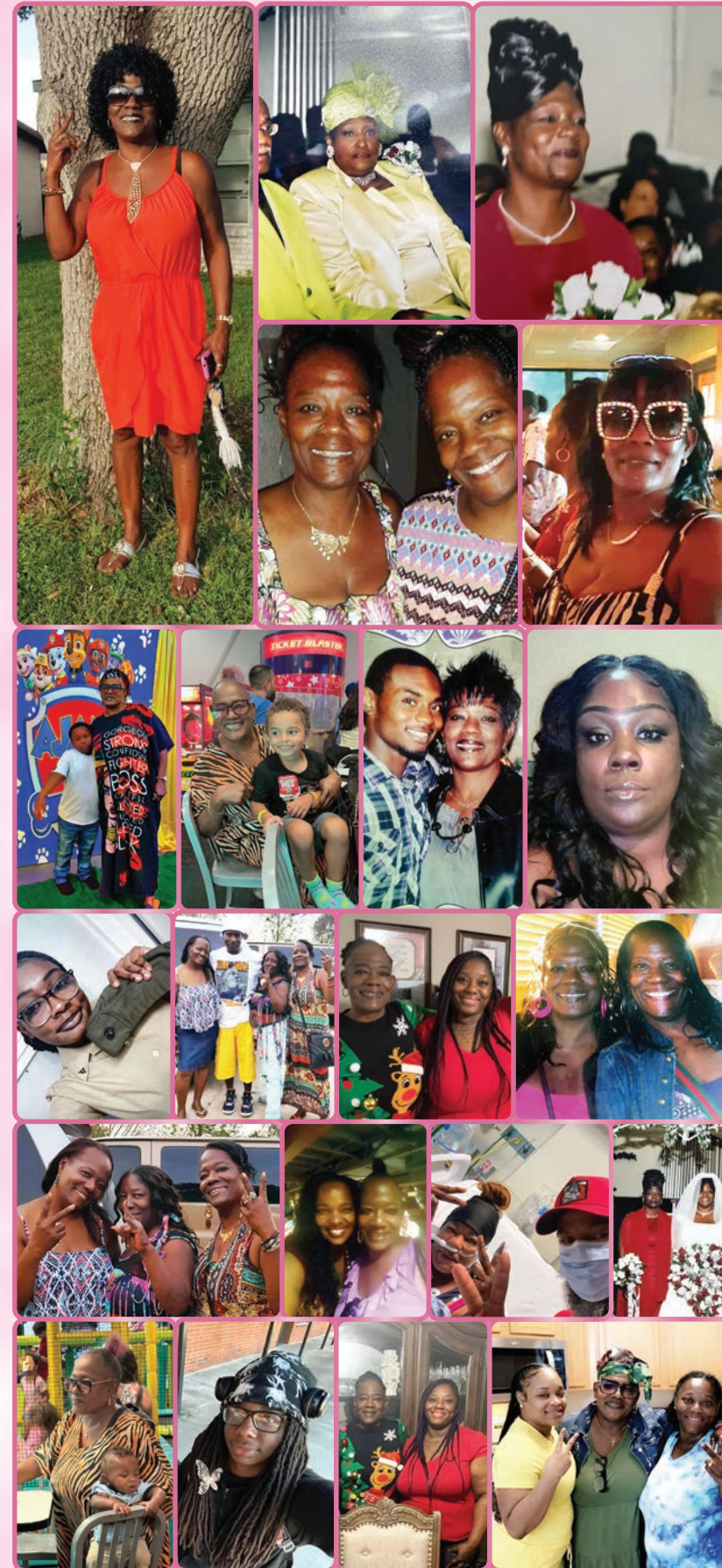
