A million times I needed you, a million times I cried.

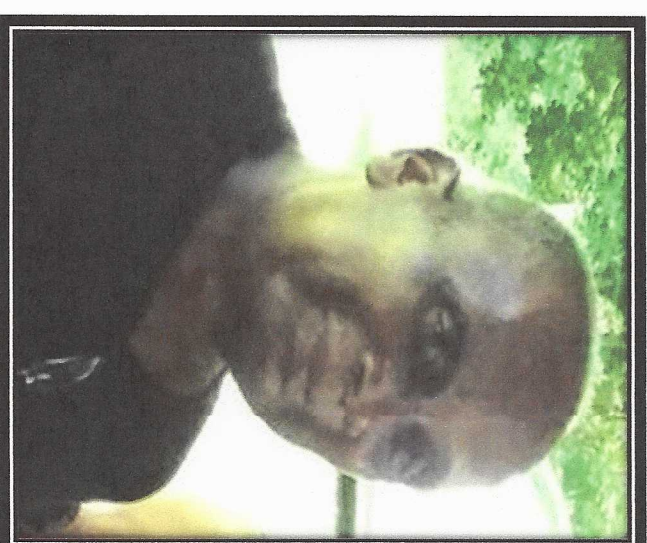
If love alone could have saved you, you never would have died.
